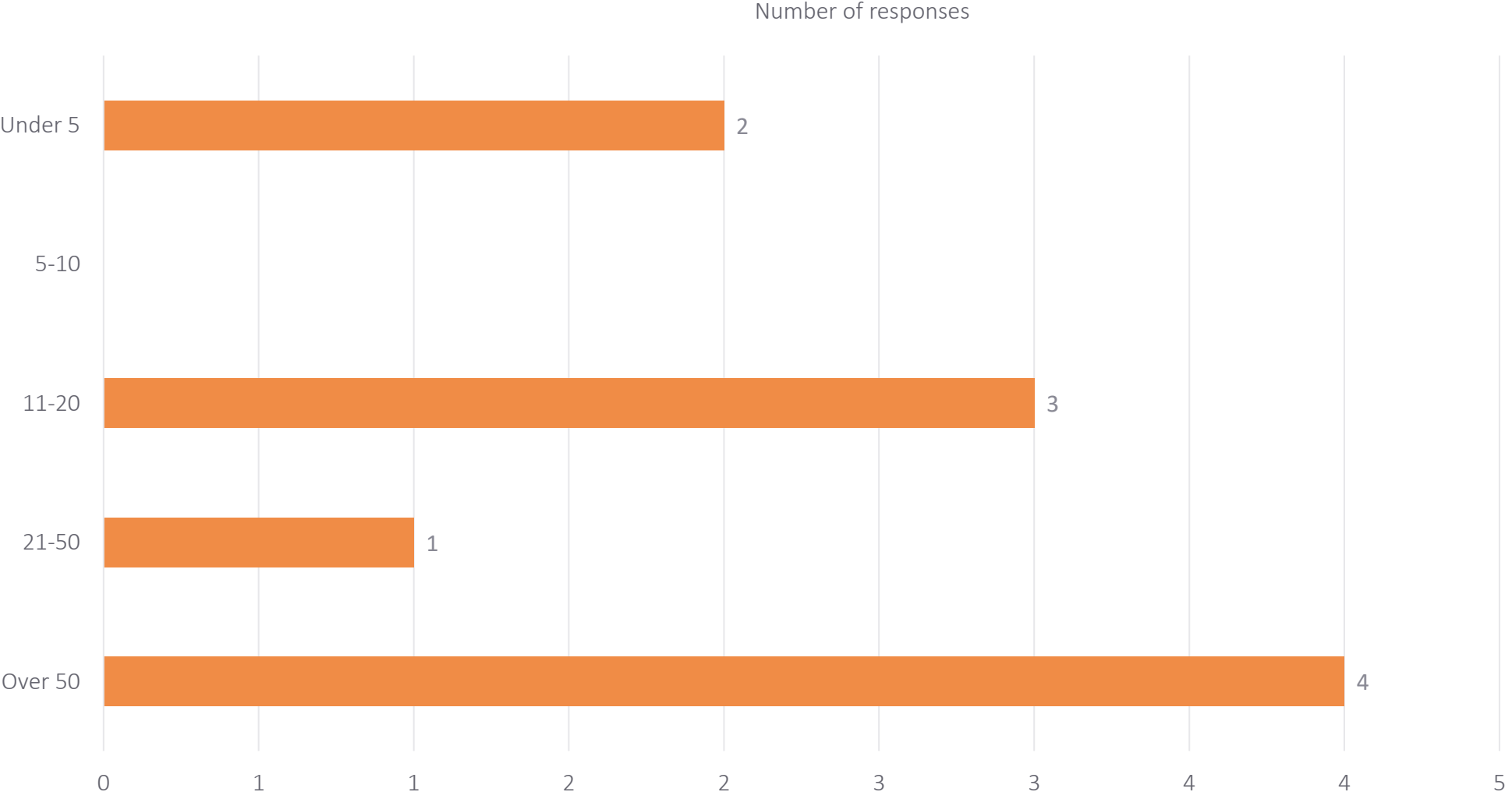

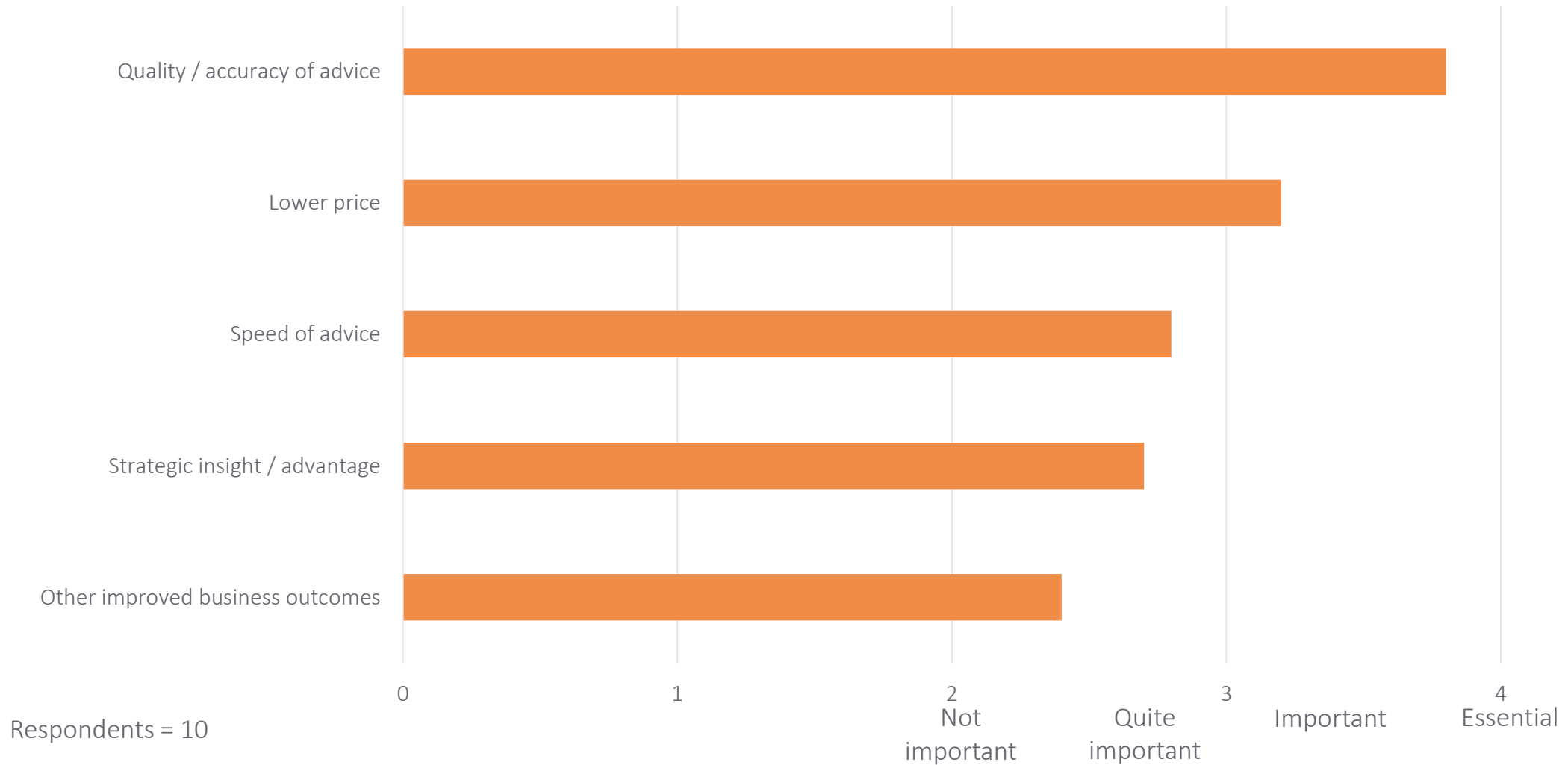
Firm profile - Number of in-house lawyers (global)



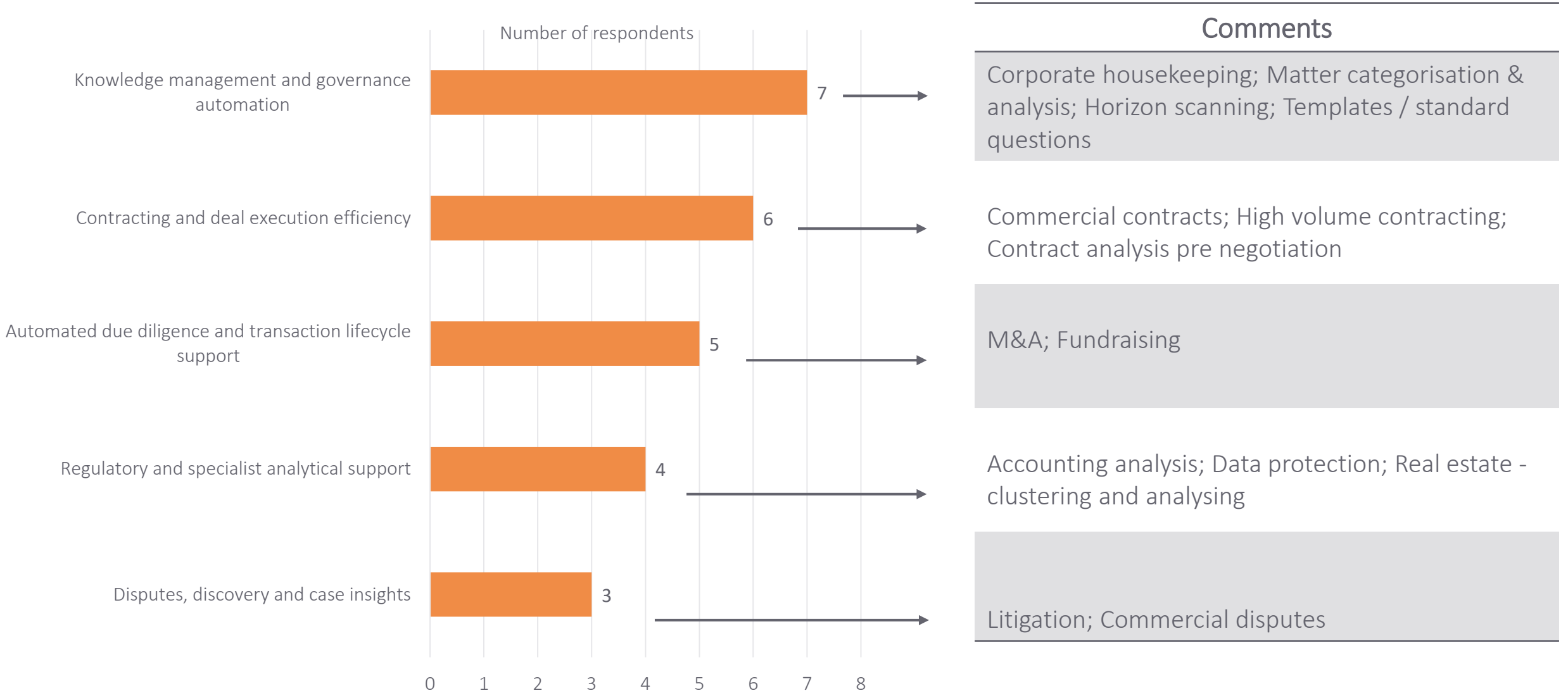

Rating each output on how important they are

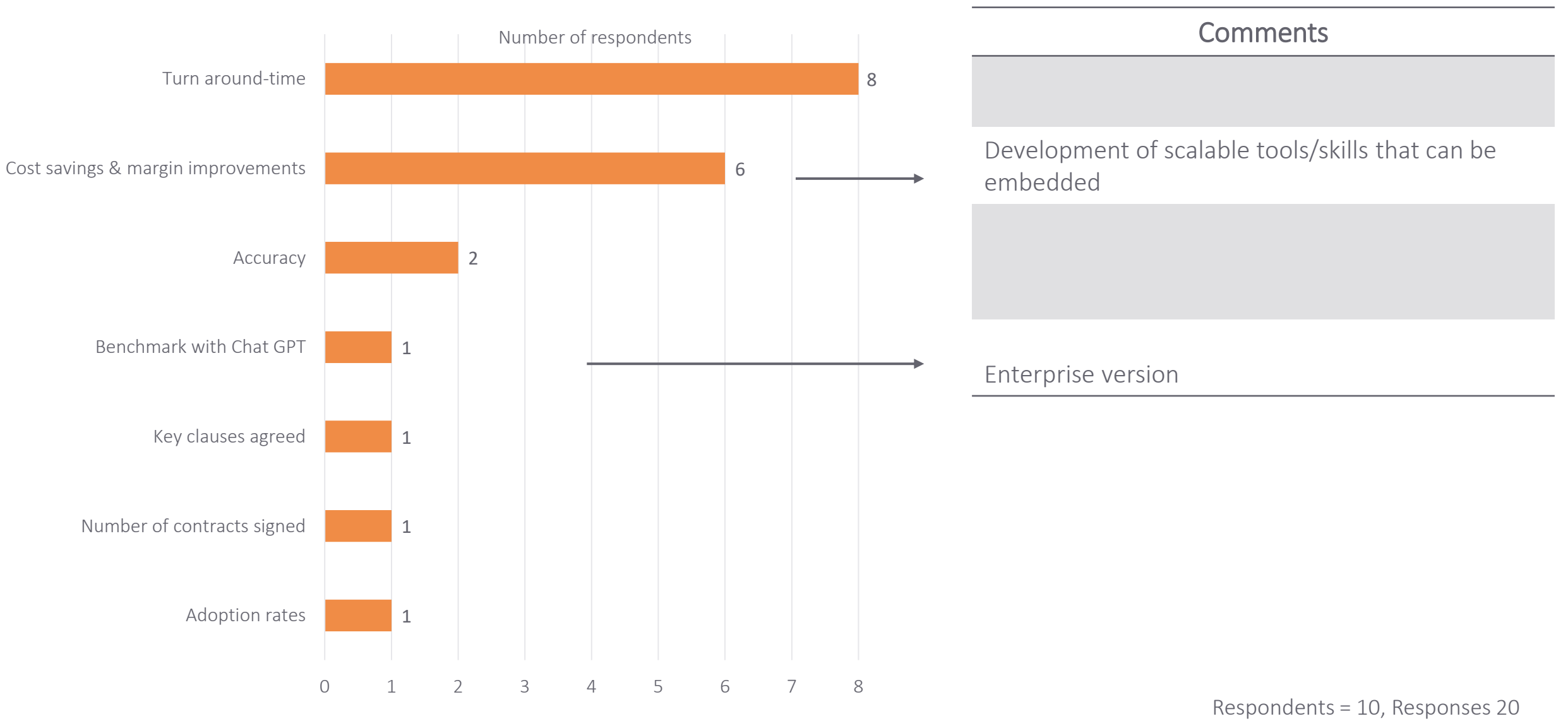


The areas of work where AI-enabled services are expected to deliver most value

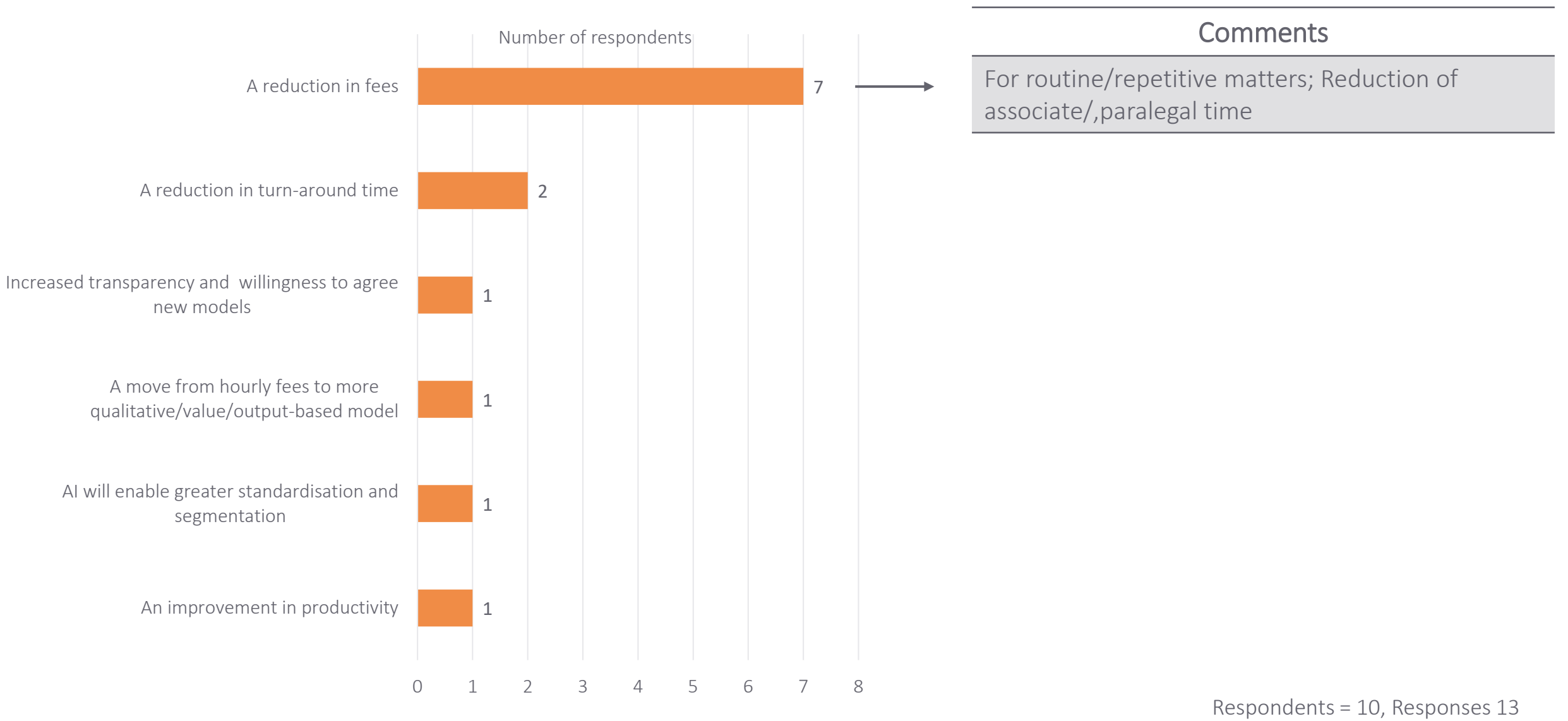

The important KPIs for measuring the benefit of AI-enabled legal services

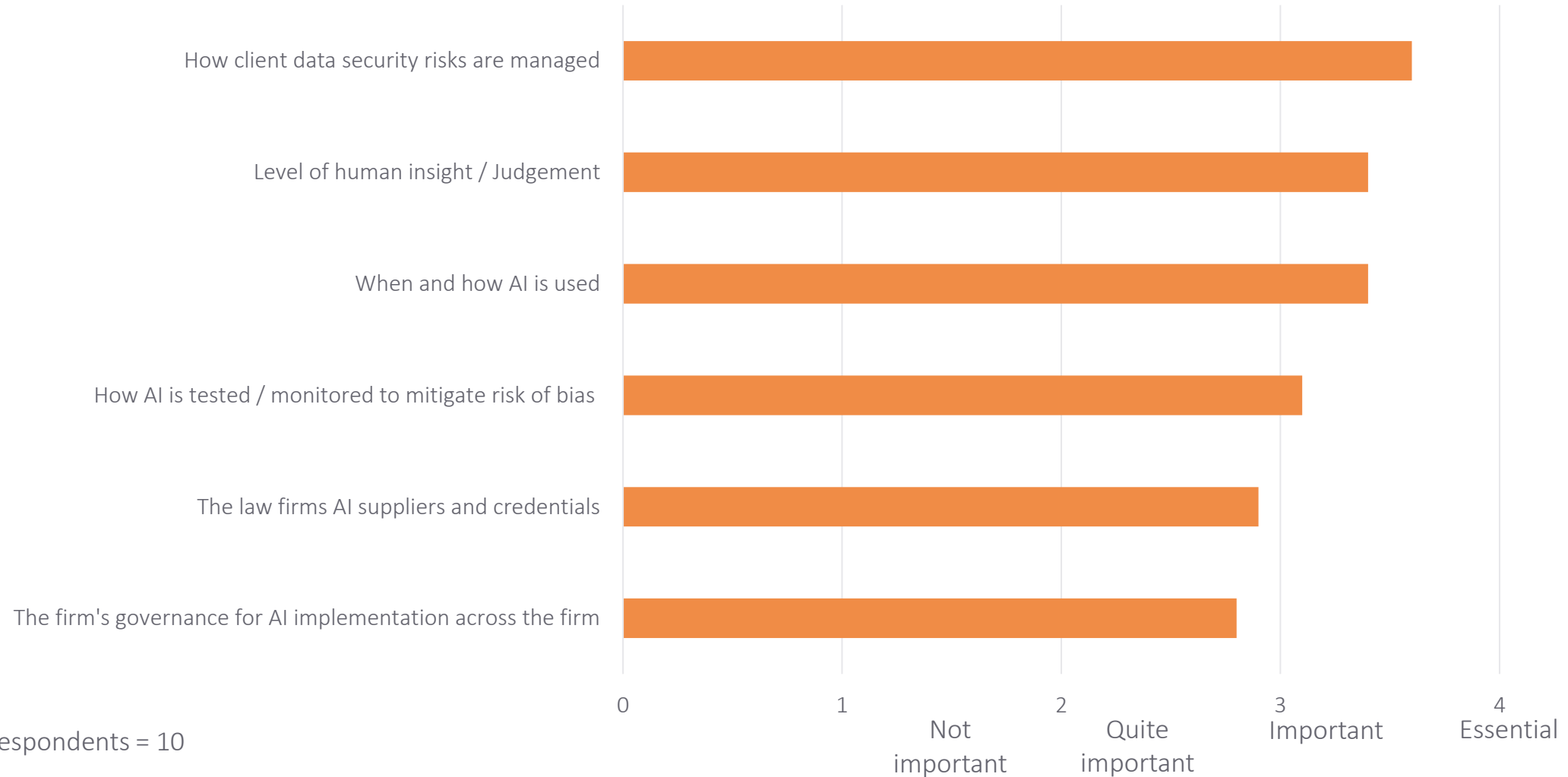


Your expectations in terms of fee models / reductions for AI-enabled legal services

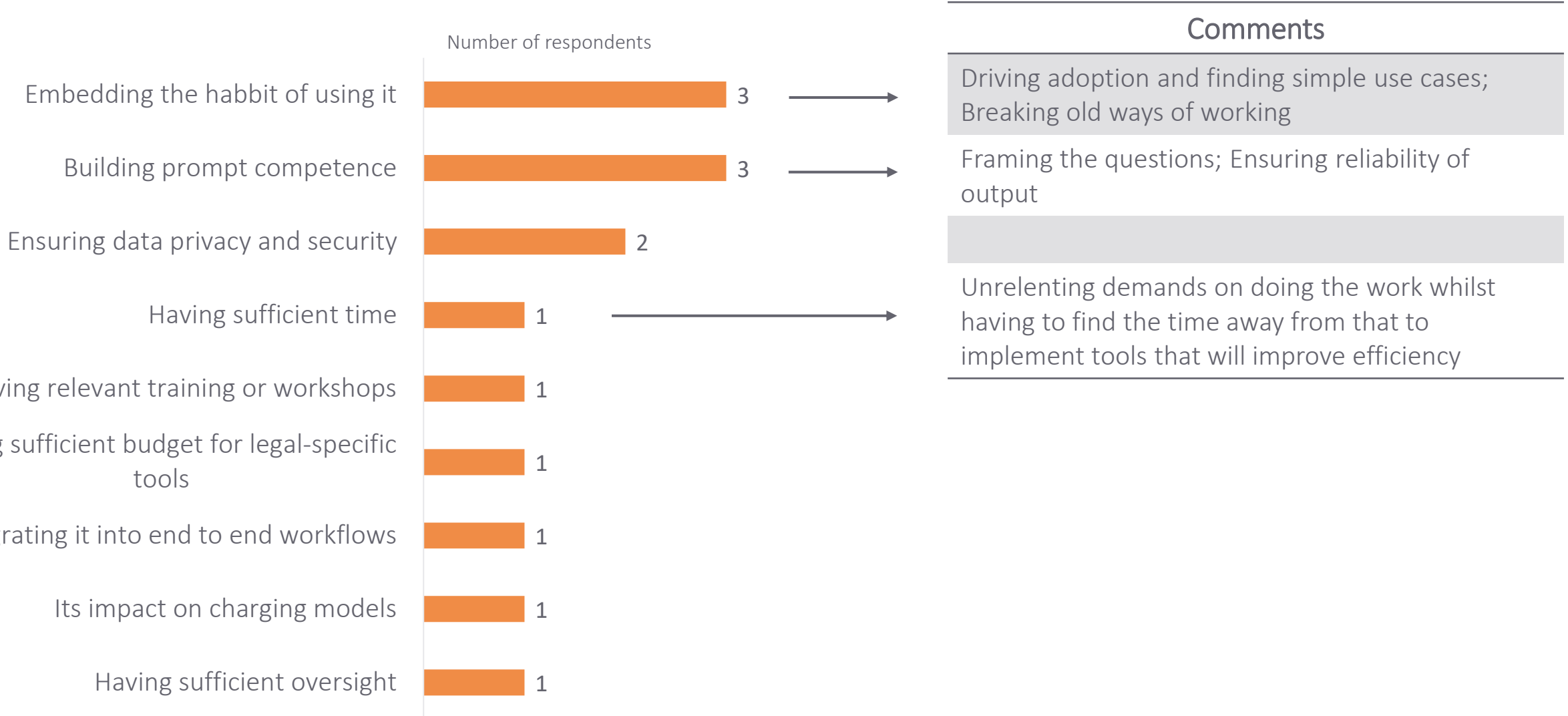

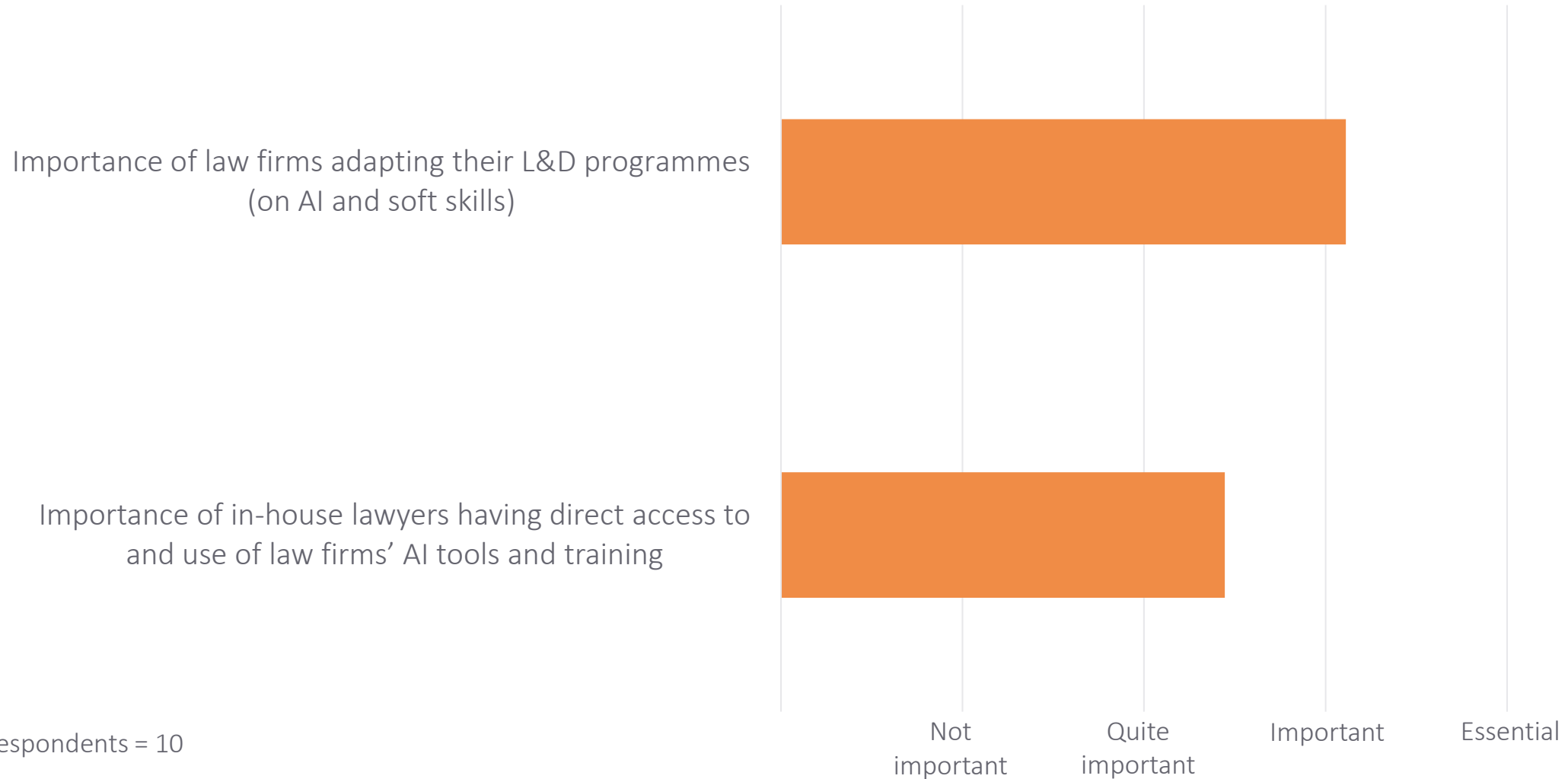
The challenges you face when implementing AI tools with your in-house team

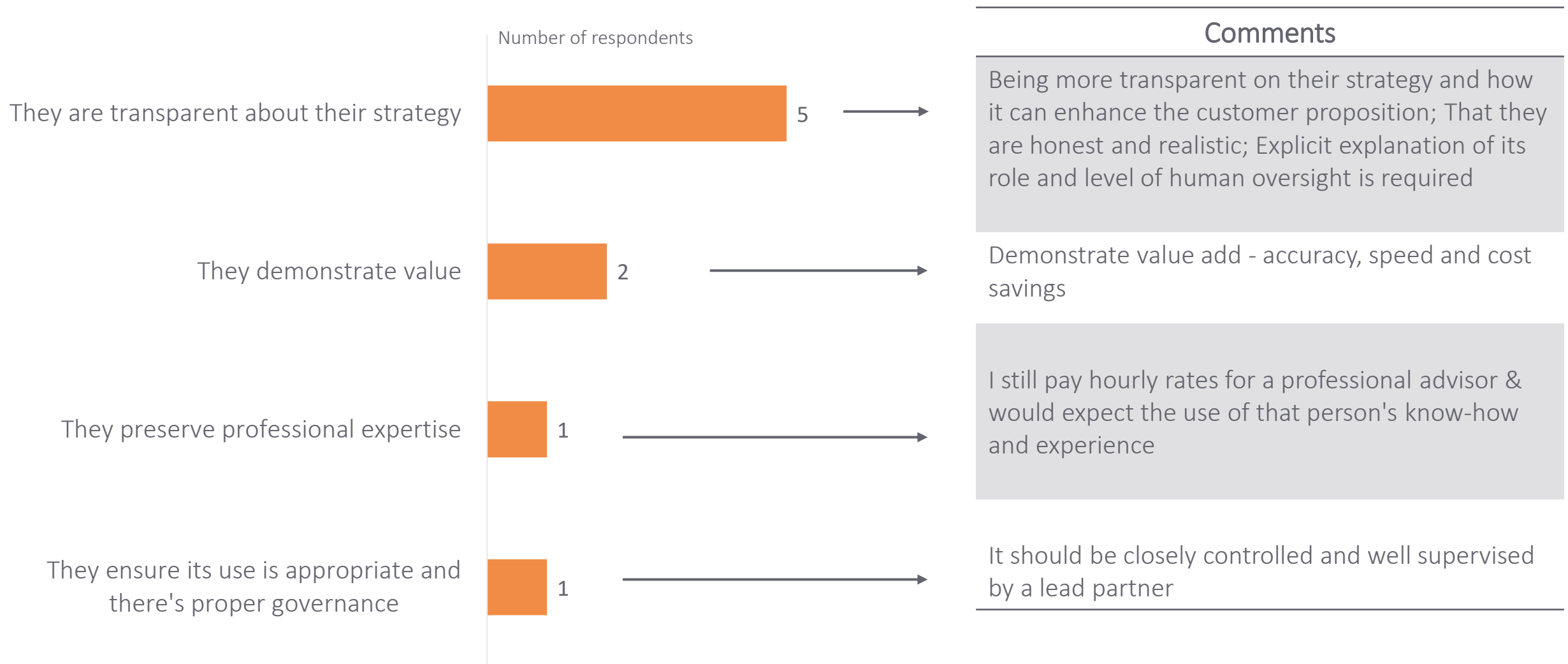
